At the time it was built, St. Isaac's Cathedral was the largest church in Russia. It was dedicated to St. Isaac of Dalmatia, the patron saint of Peter the Great who was born on his feast day.

Herman Epstein (1806-1867) played a leading role in constructing railroad lines between Warsaw and Vienna (1845) and Warsaw and Bromberg (1857), brokering loans from the Rothschilds in Frankfurt. Between 1857 and 1865, he was chairman of the board of both railways. Epstein was awarded hereditary patents of nobility and served as an honorary board member of the Polish Philanthropic Council.



Alexander Arkadievich Suvorov (1804-1882) was the grandson of the renowned Fieldmarshal Alexander Vasiliyevich Suvorov, Count of Rymnik, Generalissimo of all Russia, and son of Lt. General Arkadi Suvorov, who fought in the Napoleonic and Turkish Wars. He served as Governor General of Riga from 1848 to 1861, then as Governor General of St. Petersburg until 1866. It was A.A. Suvorov who announced the death of Tsar Alexander II at the hands of assassins in 1881. This medal was issued by one of the many societies of which he was a patron during his time as General Governor of St. Petersburg.

Суворов Александр Аркадьевич (1804-1882) - Российский государственный, общественный и военный деятель. Внук генералиссимуса А.В. Суворова. Кавалер всех Российских и нескольких десятков европейских орденов.

С 1828 г. флигель-адыотант Николая І. Суворов вышел к собравшемуся у Зимнего дворца народу и сообщил о кончине Государя.





A mere 225 pieces were struck to be used for presentation. In his book, "Outlines of Certain Types of Russian Coins in the Past Two Centuries" (Moscow 1904), S.I. Chizhov notes that 200 pieces were given out by Nicholas II as special gifts, with the remaining 25 coins being turned over to Grand Duke Mikhailovich. Extremely rare. Extremely fine



## Extremely Rave 1916 Patterns

During World War I, Russia proposed to devalue the copper currency yet again, going from 50 Roubles to the pood to 75 Roubles to the pood. A series of patterns were made to that end. But because of the chaos into which Russia had devolved, the new coinage idea was abandoned, and today the 1916 patterns are extremely rare.

As a reply to an inquiry for help from the Russian Government, on Feb. 5th, 1915, the British Admiralty sent the H.M.S. "Jupiter" to Archangelsk. The White Sea was frozen, and 2 Russian regular icebreakers were broken down and out of service. A cargo ship "Thracia", loaded with military equipment and ammunition, got caught in the ice off Archangelsk, and "Jupiter" was sent to the rescue. With great difficulties and hardship, the "Jupiter" got the towline on the "Thracia", and started the tow for Archangelsk. The tow rope parted under the strain, and volunteers were requested to man the longboat, retrieve the ends of the towrope and splice it together, sixteen volunteers on a longboat performed this extremely hard task, all done in under -20C temperatures. As a result, after 2 days of extremely hard work, the "Thracia" was saved and towed for 20 kilometers to Archangelsk. The entire crew of H.M.S. "Jupiter" was awarded with Russian awards, and the list of names was printed in the "London Gazette" on November 19th, 1919. They were also presented to King George V and congratulated.

It is rumored that the Russian Emperor Nicholas II was on his tour in Archangelsk in August of 1916, and personally handed out these awards to all the crewmen of "Jupiter" on August 4th, 1916.

Вся команда "Юпитера" была награждена русскими орденами и медалями, список имен напечатан в "Лондонской Газете" от 19го ноября 1919г. Они также были официально представлены королю Георгу V.

Окончил Морской корпус в 1904 г., принадлежал к так называемому "Первому царскому выпуску". Назначен на крейсер "Изумруд", участвовал в Цусимском сражении. Затем плавал на "Славе", а по окончании класса подводного плавания в 1908 г. командовал подводной лодкой "Касатка" в Сибирской флотилии. Затем состоял в должности флаг-офицера штаба Командующего Сибирской флотилией. Сначала войны 1914., будучи лейтенантом, был назначен на должность командира подводной лодки 2-го ранга "Нерпа", был произведен в ст.лейтенанты и награжден боевыми наградами. В 1915 г. назначен начальником 4-го дивизиона Черноморской бригады подводного плавания и начальником школы подводного плавания для офицеров в Балаклаве. В Донской Армии в 1917-1918 гг. 



#### 2083 Documented Group of Levchuk Timofei Ippolitovich.

Comrade Levchuk T. I. participated in the Civil War, and later in the infamous raids for forcefully taking away "extra" food supplies from the well to do farmers. In the late 20's – early 30's he was serving in the Tashkent NKVD (UzSSR), fighting against local basmachi formations and gangs. We found no record of his services later than 1938, suggesting that he either never made it out of Tashkent alive, or was purged during Stalin's Purges of the late 1930's...

Никакой информации датированной после 1938г. не найдено, вероятно товарищ Левчук был либо убит во время ликвидаций банд, либо попал под "чистки" Сталина конца 1930-х годов.
